What are the qualifications?

- ◆ National Professional Qualification for **Middle Leadership** (NPQML) - *Leading a team (110 study hours)*
- ◆ National Professional Qualification for **Senior Leadership** (NPQSL) - *Leading across a school (140 study hours)*
- ◆ National Professional Qualification for **Headship** (NPQH) - *Leading a school (175 study hours) **from September 2018***

What's involved?

The normal duration of study is 6 to 12 months (2 or 3 terms). Each module requires attendance at a series of online and face-to-face sessions with practical learning in your school as well as extended learning, reading and reflection.

You'll need to complete one induction session, six module and webinar sessions as well as a final assessment. Each module requires attendance at a series of online and face-to-face sessions with practical learning in your school as well as extended learning, reading and reflection.

Content Areas

The NPQ content & assessment framework identifies 6 content areas, for each NPQ level, which set out *what* a leader should know or be able to do. The 6 content areas are common to each NPQ level, but the knowledge and skills within them increases in sophistication, depth and breadth progressively through the NPQ levels. They are:

- ◆ **Strategy and Improvement**
- ◆ **Teaching and Curriculum Excellence**
- ◆ **Leading with Impact**
- ◆ **Working in Partnership**
- ◆ **Managing Resources and Risks**
- ◆ **Increasing Capability**

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Experience & exemptions

Previous training and experience may be helpful for participants joining any NPQ programme.

No exemptions are granted but you may be able to use your NPQ qualification to contribute towards a Master's or higher degree.

How to apply

Application deadlines to start during 2017-18 are:

For Autumn 2017 start, apply by:

- ◆ Friday 16th November 2017

For Spring 2017 start, apply by:

- ◆ Friday 5th January 2018

For Autumn 2018 start, apply using the 2018 application form, by:

- ◆ Friday 13th July 2018

The NPQ content & assessment framework identifies seven leadership behaviours, common to each NPQ level, which set out *how* the best leaders operate. They are:

- ◆ **Commitment**
- ◆ **Collaboration**
- ◆ **Personal Drive**
- ◆ **Resilience**
- ◆ **Awareness**
- ◆ **Integrity**
- ◆ **Respect**

NPQ leaders will work with participants to evaluate the participant's strength in each behaviour theme at the beginning of their NPQ programme, and plan how the participant will develop these behaviours during their NPQ study.

Assessment Criteria

For each content area, participants will be assessed against the assessment criteria listed for each NPQ level, through a series of defined assessment tasks according to the national mark scheme provided by DfE. Participants will be expected to draw upon the relevant bodies of research or examples that relate to the nature of their project.

Assessment Tasks

Each NPQ level has defined tasks setting out how participants must be assessed. Each participant will need to complete a project with supporting evidence for submission as part of the assessment stage.

- ◆ For **NPQML** and **NPQSL**, this consists of one project, split into two parts.
- ◆ For **NPQH**, from September 2018, this consists of two separate projects, one of which must be based on each participant's experiences during a 9-day placement in another school.
