Supporting Children with Speech & Language Needs: a choice of two 1 day events for **Teaching Assistants working in North Lincolnshire** with identified children who have speech and language learning difficulties. Each event aims to help TAs to improve the quality of children's individual learning within the classroom. Applications can be made to attend **either or both** of the events described below, in the same term or across two terms, according to school and individual preferences.

Supporting Children with Language Skills (1 day)

Supporting Children with Language Skills is a 1 day event for Teaching Assistants who work with identified children who are experiencing difficulties with language learning and who are struggling to communicate with others. This event will focus on language development and explain why communication can break down.

The day's programme will combine teaching sessions with practical activities as well as opportunities to discuss current experiences. Delegates will be given an overview of resources as well as practical approaches to help children with language learning difficulties achieve and make progress.

The event will be led by a Speech & Language Therapist, who is an experienced schools' trainer from the NHS Children's Therapy Service.

Supporting Children with Speech Sound Skills (1 day)

Supporting Children with Speech Sound Skills is a 1 day event for Teaching Assistants working with identified children who are experiencing difficulties with speech sounds and who are struggling to communicate with others. This event will provide an overview of the factors which can affect the development of speech sounds and what this means for literacy learning.

The day's programme will combine teaching sessions with practical activities as well as opportunities to discuss current experiences. Delegates will be given an overview of resources as well as practical approaches to help children with speech sound difficulties achieve and make progress.

The event will be led by a *Speech & Language Therapist*, who is an experienced schools' trainer from the NHS Children's Therapy Service.
